PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Dear friends in Christ, we begin with the long-awaited mission in Our lady of Fatima parish and surely a source of blessing for all of us in pastorate. The evangelist Luke tells us that Jesus “sent them (disciples) in groups of two by two to the towns and places where he was going to pass.” (Cf Lk 10) From today the missionaries will begin visiting your homes, blessings your homes and invite all those who may be away from the Church to return to the fold of Christ, the good shepherd. The mission is a time of blessing, because it is the same Christ who comes in each of the missionaries.

“Whoever listens to you listens to me; whoever rejects you rejects me; but whoever rejects me rejects him who sent me.” (Lk10:16) As a pastor it is my duty to bring the announcement of Jesus to every one of you, and I do with the conviction that the Church itself is missionary. “The Church is missionary by its nature; therefore, evangelization constitutes a duty and a right of each of its members” (*Lumen Gentium 17*). The great missionary Pope St. John Paul II states the following, “The Lord calls us to go beyond ourselves and to share with others the blessings we have received, beginning with the gift of faith, which cannot be considered as a private privilege but must be seen as a gift to be shared with those who have not yet received it. Such activity will benefit faith itself since faith is strengthened when it is shared.” (*World Missions Day Message 1992*) There are many in the whole pastorate who generously have helped in different areas for the success of the mission. Thank you. Another important aspect of the mission is that the mission must be supported by prayer; if we don't pray and ask for the fruits of it, everything collapses. That is why the missionaries will have, as part of the mission activities prayers every morning before the 8:15 am Mass; Eucharistic adoration from 6:45 to 7:45 am, at the end they will pray morning prayer. You are invited to join and accompany the missionaries who pray for our parish. I also want to call upon all those who will not be able to physically participate, although I know that they will unite themselves spiritually through their prayers and sacrifices. To you who are in nursing homes, assisted living homes or at home, to join the parish mission through your prayer and sacrifice, with patience and acceptance of your pains, God will accept your offerings and send abundant blessings to all of us. St. John Paul II affirms, “In this regard the prayer and the sacrifice of the sick take on great value when their suffering is intimately associated to the Passion of Christ. Those who are dedicated to the care of the sick will not fail to instruct them and encourage them to offer their suffering in union with Christ Crucified for the salvation of the world.” (cf. *Redemptoris missio*, 78) Let us open wide the door of our heart to Christ. “Christus Vincit! Christus Regnat! Christus Imperat!

LITURGY CORNER

WE PREPARE FOR MASS

Upon entering the Church we should sign ourselves with holy water. This is a sacramental which washes away our venial sins by the contrition it arouses in us, like the words of the antiphon *Asperges me*. It also reminds us that we have been delivered from the bondage of sin through the waters of Baptism.

As we approach the beginning of Mass, we should pause to consider how great is the Sacrament in which we are about to partake. The great gift of the Eucharist is one which we should not take lightly, lest we risk missing out on the graces that we receive by being properly disposed. We can prepare ourselves by shutting out our worries and distractions.

In order to receive Communion worthily, we must be in a state of grace. The best way to be sure of this is to avail ourselves of the Sacrament of Penance regularly. While venial sins should not prevent our receiving Communion, we commit sacrilege if we knowingly receive our Lord while in a state of mortal sin.

While we prepare our bodies for the Sacrament by means of the Eucharist Fast. Through the discipline of denying our body, we show our humility as well as a spiritual hunger for what we are about to receive. This fast begins at one hour before receiving Communion. The sick, the elderly, and expectant or nursing mothers are exempt from this.

The best way to unite ourselves with the offering of the Holy Sacrifice is by praying before Mass. This could be by praying the Rosary or to read the readings which are assigned for this particular Sunday Mass. Bring to mind the intentions which we wish to pray for, names of families, deceases, the sick, conversions of someone, peace, etc.

One aspect that we must foster in our communities with greater commitment is the experience of silence. “if we are to accept in our hearts the full resonance of the voice of the Holy Spirit and to unite our personal prayer more closely to the Word of God and the public voice of the Church”. St John Paul II. *Spiritus et Sponsa*.

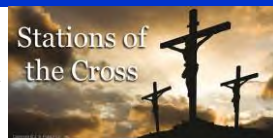

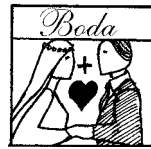
