PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Dear friends in Christ, this Sunday we finish the holy mission in the parish at Our Lady of Fatima. Days of much joy and spiritual fruits. To see so many young people willing to give everything for Christ and follow him in the consecrated life is a sign that the Church is alive and the message of Christ is fresh and new, "Christ yesterday, today and for ever." As we know, every missionary leaves everything to respond to the invitation that our blessed Lord makes, "Go ye into the whole world, and preach the gospel to every creature." (Mk 16:15) Missionaries go all over the world with courage and confidence placed in the same words of Jesus, "I am with you all days, even to the consummation of the world." (Mt 28:20) and in another place Jesus tells his disciples, "In the world you will have trouble, but take courage, I have conquered the world." (Jn 16:33) Let us take examples of these young missionaries and respond generously to the many invitations that the Church makes; let us resolve to embark in the great adventure of being missionaries in our own community, in our parish. Remember: We don't need to go to unknown places, this is our mission territory, in our home with our family, in our parish with our fellow parishioners, in our city with our society. "It is a more blessed thing to give, rather than to receive." (Act. 20:35) We should abandon ourselves in the provident hands of God and leave our comfort zone and share our faith with those who are far away from the Church. It comes to my mind the poem attributed to the great Spaniard mystic, St. Teresa of Avila, "Christ has no body now but yours. No hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes through which he looks with compassion on this world. Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands through which he blesses all the world. Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, yours are the eyes, you are his body. Christ has no body now on earth but yours," meaning God wants to reach out to many through us, to visit the sick, dying, those in prison, etc. He wants to speak through us, His poor humble and sinful servants. Our baptized identity enables us to carry out this mission. We do not need any course to carry the word of God; in the Sacrament of Confirmation we are given the title of apostles, the same Gift that filled the apostles with apostolic zeal that invaded the hearts and minds, comes to us to set us forth.

Thanks to all the missionaries, thanks to all those who have generously offered their time and talent to receive the missionaries in their homes. Thanks to so many prayers and offerings from those who joined the mission through their suffering and illnesses, to you brothers and sisters who might be in nursing homes or are confined in your homes, thank you so much. "*Christus Vincit! Christus Regnat! Christus Imperat!*"

LITURGY CORNER

PRIEST'S VESTMENTS

Amice is a rectangle of fine linen. The Priest places it for a moment on his head, and then allows it to rest upon his shoulders. It was originally a covering for the head and neck and was worn like a hood.



The Amice

Alb. The Alb is a wide linen tunic reaching to the feet and covering the whole body. It symbolizes the purity of the Christian soul, having been washed in the blood of the Lamb. (Apoc. 7:14)

Cincture. The Cincture, or girdle, is a cord of linen fastened about the waist to confine the alb. It is a symbol of chastity. There are also cords dedicated to saints.



Cincture

Stole. The Stole is a long band of silk. The Priest wears it around the neck and it represents immortality. Vestment proper to the Priest at Mass and during other sacred actions. At Mass the priest uses the chasuble over the alb and stole.



Chasuble. The chasuble means "little house" and it is the outer and chief vestment of the Priest. It is usually ornamented with a large cross on the back, and sometimes on the front of the garment. It symbolizes the yoke of Christ.



Cope. You may see the Priest wearing a garment like this during the Benediction. This flowing robe is called a Cope, and the large scarf he uses to grip the monstrance is called the Humeral Veil.

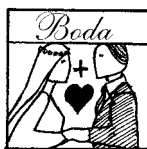
